It is requested that you state your name for the record, then proceed to address the Commission. All speakers shall observe civility, decorum, and good behavior.

- A written appeal is filed with the Public Works Department within the fifteen (15) day period.
- Approved traffic improvements with a significant fiscal impact that have not been budgeted within the Capital Improvement Program require City Council approval.

APPEAL PROCEDURE

A written appeal of a Traffic Commission determination must be submitted to the office of the City Traffic Engineer within fifteen (15) calendar days of that Commission action, and clearly state the basis for the appeal and the error made by the Traffic Commission in reaching their decision. This appeal shall be accompanied by an initial deposit of \$500.00; call Francisco Vasquez, Administrative Assistant, at (714) 744-5537 to prepare an estimate for you.

The City Clerk, upon filing of said appeal, will agendize your appeal as an informal hearing before the City Council within thirty (30) calendar days of receipt. Staff received a request from Living Stone Korean Methodist Church for the City to consider the installation of red curb on both sides of their driveway at 295 S. Flower Street to enhance visibility when exiting the church driveway. The church is located near the intersection of S. Flower Street and W. Larkspur Drive. The driveway for the church is on the east side of S. Flower Street, approximately 240 feet south of the intersection.

S. Flower Street, spanning from W. Larkspur Drive to W. Palmyra Avenue, is a two-lane roadway measuring 40 feet in width, with parking permitted on both sides of the street. The land use along this stretch of Flower Street is a mix of single-family residences, multi-family residences, churches, and businesses. Flower Street, along Larkspur Drive and Palmyra Avenue, features a 90 degree bend (elbow) that influences the alignment of the street and the visibility coming out of the driveway when vehicles are parked along the street.

A field review conducted by City staff determined that there is approximately 110 feet of curbside parking available north of the subject driveway, accommodating five parking spaces. Staff recommends installing 10 feet of red curb to the north of the driveway. South of the driveway, there is approximately 66 feet of curbside parking available, accommodating three parking spaces. Staff recommends installing 25 feet of red curb south of the driveway based on the street geometry and

driveway location. The proposed red curb is expected to result in the loss of one parking space but would enhance site access. The proposed curb markings are similar to those installed near other driveways along the corridor.




Curbs Subject Area

6. DISCUSSION AND BACKGROUND

City staff received multiple requests to install red curb along the east side of N. Canal Street to support transit operations at Orange County Transportation Authority (OCTA) Bus Stops 5308 and 5309. The requested red curb would ensure dedicated curb space for safe and efficient passenger pick-up and drop-off.

Bus Stop 5308 is located approximately 130 feet north of E. Meats Avenue and Bus Stop 5309 is located approximately 560 feet north of E. Meats Avenue. Both stops are on the east side of N. Canal Street.

N. Canal Street, between E. Meats Avenue and E. Heim Avenue, is a two-lane roadway with a width of 44 feet. Parking is currently permitted on both sides of the street. Adjacent land uses include single

-family residential homes, commercial retail, educational institutions, and private recreational facilities.

Following recent parking restrictions implemented on the west side of Canal Street, motorists have increasingly utilized the east side for parking, resulting in frequent obstruction of the OCTA bus stops.

A field review conducted by City staff identified approximately 250 feet of existing curbside parking between Meats Avenue and the first driveway of The Village at Orange shopping center, located at 2100 N. Tustin Street, accommodating roughly eleven vehicles.

Due to safety concerns with vehicles parked near the intersection, staff installed 150 feet of red curb from Meats Avenue to Bus Stop 5308 on September 11, 2025, leaving approximately four parking spaces available to the public. This red curb provides more margin for buses turning right onto Canal Street, helping bus drivers do so without encroaching into the opposing lane.

To assess the appropriate length of parking restrictions at Bus Stop 5309, City staff consulted with OCTA. OCTA requested a 350-foot red curb zone to facilitate safe and efficient transit service. This installation would reduce available parking by approximately sixteen spaces.

Between the southernmost driveway of The Village at Orange shopping center and the beginning of the proposed red curb zone for Bus Stop 5309, approximately 40 feet of curbside parking remains. Beyond the proposed restriction, there is an additional 270 feet of curbside parking before reaching Cumberland Road, accommodating approximately twelve vehicles.

To enhance transit accessibility and support OCTA operations, staff recommends that the City Traffic Commission ratify the recently installed 150 feet of red curb installed north of E. Meats Avenue and approve the installation of 350 feet of red curb along the east side of N. Canal Street, north of the first driveway to the Village Shopping Center, adjacent to Bus Stop 5309.

-family residential homes, commercial retail, educational institutions, and private recreational facilities.

Following recent parking restrictions implemented on the west side of Canal Street, motorists have increasingly utilized the east side for parking, resulting in frequent obstruction of the OCTA bus stops.

A field review conducted by City staff identified approximately 250 feet of existing curbside parking between Meats Avenue and the first driveway of The Village at Orange shopping center, located at 2100 N. Tustin Street, accommodating roughly eleven vehicles.

Due to safety concerns with vehicles parked near the intersection, staff installed 150 feet of red curb from Meats Avenue to Bus Stop 5308 on September 11, 2025, leaving approximately four parking spaces available to the public. This red curb provides more margin for buses turning right onto Canal Street, helping bus drivers do so without encroaching into the opposing lane.

To assess the appropriate length of parking restrictions at Bus Stop 5309, City staff consulted with OCTA. OCTA requested a 350-foot red curb zone to facilitate safe and efficient transit service. This installation would reduce available parking by approximately sixteen spaces.

Between the southernmost driveway of The Village at Orange shopping center and the beginning of the proposed red curb zone for Bus Stop 5309, approximately 40 feet of curbside parking remains. Beyond the proposed restriction, there is an additional 270 feet of curbside parking before reaching Cumberland Road, accommodating approximately twelve vehicles.

To enhance transit accessibility and support OCTA operations, staff recommends that the City Traffic Commission ratify the recently installed 150 feet of red curb installed north of E. Meats Avenue and approve the installation of 350 feet of red curb along the east side of N. Canal Street, north of the first driveway to the Village Shopping Center, adjacent to Bus Stop 5309.





Background

Existing Conditions

The 100 North block of Parker Street primarily supports residential uses, with the exception of commercial parcels on the northwest and northeast corners of Chapman Avenue and Parker Street. The west side of the 100 block of Pixley Street primarily supports residential uses, with the exception of the commercial parcel on the northwest corner of Chapman Avenue and Pixley Street. The east side of the 100 block of Pixley Street supports mixed used commercial with 1-hour time-limited parking from Chapman Avenue to 125 N. Pixley Street, except for a single blue curb space adjacent to 541 W. Chapman Avenue.

Proposed Modifications

Pixley Street

The aforementioned blue curb was installed around October 2017 at the request of the manager of Le Gourmet Culinary, who sought a designated accessible space adjacent to the business. Upon recent outreach, staff confirmed that Le Gourmet Culinary is no longer operating at 541 W. Chapman Avenue. As the blue curb designation is no longer necessary, staff recommends its removal, and replacement with a 1-hour time-limited parking stall to align with similar restrictions for other commercial frontages on this street.

Parker Street

Parker Street is comprised of residential and commercial uses, each of which have different parking needs. In general, commercial uses tend to require more parking turnover than residential uses; however, there are no existing parking time limits in effect. Moreover, the recent recommendation to implement permit parking on the residential portions of Parker Street may leave the commercial frontages vulnerable to parking intrusion, unless a time limit (1-hour parking) is implemented.

<u>Analysis</u>

The commercial parcels in this area have limited off-street parking for their customers and clients, and the demand for on-street parking in the subject area is high throughout the day. Implementing time-limited parking along the commercial frontages of Parker Street and Pixley Street will encourage curbside turnover, which may be desirable for nearby businesses, while protecting valuable curb space from displaced demand from nearby permit parking. It should be noted that time-limited parking will be enforced from 7:00 a.m. to 6:00 p.m. daily, in accordance with the Orange Municipal Code.


