

**SECOND AMENDMENT
TO
MAINTENANCE SERVICES AGREEMENT
[Maintenance Services for Eisenhower Park Lake & Stream]**

THIS SECOND AMENDMENT TO MAINTENANCE SERVICES AGREEMENT (the “Second Amendment”) is made and entered into as of _____, 2026 (“Effective Date”) by and between the CITY OF ORANGE, a municipal corporation (“City”), and BIO AQUATICS LAKE MANAGEMENT LLC, a California limited liability company (“Contractor”), with reference to the following.

A. City and Contractor entered into a Maintenance Services Agreement (Agreement No.7745) dated as of June 25, 2024, which is incorporated herein by this reference (the “Original Agreement”); and

B. City and Contractor amended the Original Agreement to extend an additional one year of the initial term of the Original Agreement and increase the compensation by a First Amendment to Maintenance Services Agreement (Agreement No.7745.1) dated June 10, 2025, which is incorporated herein by this reference (the “First Amendment”); and

C. City and Contractor desire to further amend the Original Agreement to modify, amend and supplement certain portions of the Original Agreement to extend an additional one year of the initial term of the Original Agreement and increase the compensation.

NOW, THEREFORE, the parties hereby agree as follows:

Section 1. **Defined Terms.** Except as otherwise defined herein, all capitalized terms used herein shall have the meanings set forth for such terms in the Original Contract.

Section 2. **Cross-References.** City and Contractor agree that all references in this First Amendment are deemed and construed to refer to the Original Agreement, as implemented by this First Amendment.

Section 3. **Revised Scope of Services.** The scope of services referenced in Exhibit A of the Original Agreement, is hereby amended, modified and supplemented to allow for contractor’s provision of an additional year of services per the at the annual rate established in the incorporated Exhibit B-2.

Section 4. **Term.** The City hereby amends Section 10 of the Original Agreement to extend the Term, commencing on July 1, 2026, and terminating on June 30, 2027.

Section 5. **Compensation.** The total not-to-exceed compensation for the services to be rendered as set forth in Section 2.a of the Original Agreement is increased by THIRTY-EIGHT THOUSAND TWO HUNDRED DOLLARS and 00/100 (\$38,200.00). Section 2.b of the Original Agreement is increased by THREE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED TWENTY DOLLARS and

00/100 (\$3,820.00) for additional contingencies. Sections 2.c is hereby amended in its entirety to read as follows:

“c. The total amount of compensation under this Agreement, including contingencies, shall not exceed ONE HUNDRED TWENTY THOUSAND ONE HUNDRED SEVENTY-FIVE DOLLARS and 00/100 (\$120,175.00).”

Section 6. **Authority of City Manager.** Pursuant to Section 3.08.430 of the Orange Municipal Code, the City Manager is authorized to approve and execute amendments to the Agreement to adjust the compensation as provided herein.

Section 7. **Integration.** This Second Amendment amends, as set forth herein, the Original Contract and, except as specifically amended hereby, the Original Contract shall remain in full force and effect. To the extent that there is any conflict or inconsistency between the terms and provisions of this Second Amendment and the terms and provisions of the Original Contract, the terms and provisions of this Second Amendment shall control and govern the rights and obligations of the parties.

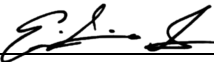

Service Period July 1, 2026 - June 30, 2027

Year-round maintenance shall include:

1. Trash and debris removal from the lake and stream. Trash and debris should be picked up and removed from the area. There shall be no blowing of debris into lake or stream. Large bricks, stones and other submerged foreign objects or debris that are visible from the sidewalk should be removed during this weekly maintenance.
2. Skimmer baskets shall be removed, inspected, cleaned, and correctly reinstalled. Missing or damaged skimmer baskets shall be reported as soon as discovered to the Parks Maintenance Supervisor.
3. Continual control, removal, and management of filamentous algae, and all other aquatic plant material.
4. Remove, trim, and maintain plant material along the stream and lake edges. Said maintenance is to include the regular trimming of the existing aquatic (Papyrus) plantings and weed removal and abatement within 5 feet of entire stream and lake edge.
5. Add Enviro-zyme and/or other biological agents as required each week to remove unwanted nutrients.
6. Maintain water quality of lake, stream, and feeder pond to be clear, free of excessive aquatic plant material, free of algae growth, free of excessive nitrates and other nutrients that negatively affect water quality, and free of trash and debris. Maintain healthy oxygen levels at all depths of the lake and stream.
7. Maintain lake ph. at 7.0.
8. Power wash all sidewalks, boulders, and hardscape adjacent to the lake one time per week to remove duck feces and other debris. Said power washing is to be accomplished using 'lake' water by means of a submersible water pump system. All power washing lake water is to be directed back into the lake. All pumping/washing equipment is to be provided by the contractor.



Monthly Maintenance (year-round): Work may occur Monday through Friday.

1. Power-wash the waterfall monthly during the first week of the month.
2. Remove and clean aerators.
3. Amend lake with biological agents as required to maintain water quality.
4. Papyrus plants along stream bed shall be trimmed and dead stalks removed, being careful not to damage new growth. Papyrus plants will be kept trimmed to ensure visibility through the park.
5. Remove all weeds, palm tree starts, and any other undesirable plant material within 5 feet from entire stream bed edge and all around lake edge.
