The bids received, with the exception of the high bid, were all within 7% of each other leading staff to conclude that the bid is competitive and reflects current market conditions.

Senior Administrative Analyst Schulze provided the staff report and reviewed the provisions contained within the proposed ordinance.

Mayor Murphy opened the Public Hearing at 7:12 p.m.

In addition, two telephone messages in opposition from Janet Stapleton and Jacqueline Slauter, and one in support from Norbert Koeller were received and distributed to Council; and one written comment in support and three in opposition were received after the deadline and were distributed to Council for their consideration.

Mayor Murphy closed the Public Hearing at 7:41 p.m.

During deliberations, Mayor pro tem Alvarez and Councilmember Monaco stated they were not in support of approving the proposed ordinance as they believe short term rentals to be a commercial use and should not be allowed in the City's neighborhoods. Council discussed the process of banning short term rentals and the potential need for professional services to enforce the ban beyond the City's current resources.

City Attorney Sheatz clarified that short term rentals are not a permitted use in the existing Orange Municipal Code. Therefore, there is no need for the Council to take further action by adopting an ordinance prohibiting short term rentals as they are currently not an approved use.

A motion was made by Mayor Murphy, seconded by Councilmember Monaco, to direct staff to retain appropriate professional services to initiate the ban and restriction of short term rentals with a report back to Council at the January 12, 2021, Regular Council meeting on any recommended actions including a recommended wind-down period of existing short term rentals. The motion carried by the following vote:

During deliberation, Council discussed the need for a policy decision about the roles and responsibilities of each of the City's current Boards, Commissions, and Committees before revising the Ordinance. In addition, Council directed staff to assign the appropriate staffing level to the DRC to include a senior level employee and legal counsel.

After further discussion, it was Council consensus to table the item until the newly elected Councilmembers have been sworn in.
