This appeal shall be accompanied by an initial deposit of \$500.00; call Dave Allenbach, Transportation Analyst, at (714) 744-5540 to prepare an estimate for you.

The City Clerk, upon filing of said appeal, will agendize your appeal as an informal hearing before the City Council within thirty (30) calendar days of receipt. All owners of property located within 300 feet of the project site will be notified of said hearing. For additional information, please call (714) 744-5540.
