4.1. Design Review No. 5077-22 - 529 S. Grand Street Duplex Unit. (Continued from September 21, 2022.)

The Committee Members discussed the following:

- Ribbon Driveway
- Placement of trash can storage and air conditioner condensers
- Consideration of design hierarchy and simplification of design
- Fence height and style
- Landscaping
- Need for design sensitivity in relation to neighboring residents
- Historic neighborhood development pattern
- Fiber cement siding as an acceptable material

A motion was made by Committee Member Fox, seconded by Committee Member Farfan, to make a final determination and approve the project with conditions presented in the staff report and the addition of the following conditions:

1. The existing fence at the front north side on the existing structure shall be reconstructed at a height of 4-feet with more pronounced rhythm of wood pilasters and top rail to create a more craftsman styling with landscaping planted in a manner to provide screening of the new unit.

2. A pad of pavers or concrete shall be added adjacent to the north side of the existing garage to accommodate six trash carts.

3. The fiber cement siding shall have a smooth finish.

4. The attic vents shall be simplified, rectangular vents to create more of a subordinate condition and distinction between the historic residence and new unit.
