#### 3. APPEAL PROCEDURE

A written appeal of a City Traffic Commission determination must be submitted to the office of the City Traffic Engineer within fifteen (15) calendar days of that Commission action, and clearly state the basis for the appeal and the error made by the City Traffic Commission in reaching their decision. This appeal shall be accompanied by an initial deposit of \$500.00; call Dave Allenbach, Transportation Analyst, at (714) 744-5540 to prepare an estimate for you.

The City Clerk, upon filing of said appeal, will agendize your appeal as an informal hearing before the City Council within thirty (30) calendar days of receipt. All owners of property located within 300 feet of the project site will be notified of said hearing. For additional information, please call (714) 744-5540.

The request is to install red curb markings on the west side of the driveway serving 293 N Citrus St. to provide an enhanced vision zone when backing out and exiting the driveway.

### 6. DISCUSSION AND BACKGROUND

A resident is requesting red curb markings to be painted on the west side of the driveway on Palm Avenue that serves his home at 293 N. Citrus St. The reason for the request is to provide enhanced sight distance when backing out of his driveway onto Palm Ave.

#### **Existing Conditions**

Palm Ave. is classified as a Collector street with one travel lane in each direction, a yellow painted centerline, a curb-to-curb width of 40 feet, and an average daily traffic volume of approximately 3,400 vehicles. The subject address is located on the southwest corner of Palm Ave. and Citrus Street. The posted speed limit on this section of Palm Ave. is 25 MPH. The intersection of Citrus St. and Palm Ave. is located approximately 100' west of Batavia St.

There is an eight-unit apartment complex on Palm Ave. located across the street from of the subject address. This apartment complex may be contributing to localized on-street parking demand. On-

street parking is allowed on both sides of Palm Ave. with the highest demand occurring during the late afternoon and evening hours.

Staff has visited the subject area several times in response to the request. The field investigation indicates there is space for approximately 2 vehicles to park between the proponent's driveway and Citrus Street. Occasionally a vehicle will park up to the proponent's drive approach, which can reduce comfort level when backing out of the driveway.

Painting 37' of red curb between the proponent's driveway and Citrus Street would enhance sight distance for the proponent and the residents of Citrus Street who exit onto Palm Avenue.

#### Accident History

Our records indicate that there have been no accidents reported in the study area in the past threeyear period.

#### **Recommendation**

Staff recommends that the Traffic Commission approve of the request for 37' of red curb markings on the west side of the driveway serving 293 N. Citrus St.

According to the proponent, there may be an auto sales business in the area that is using Barkley Avenue to store inventory. These are on the street early in the morning and utilize much of the available on-street parking before many local business employees arrive. This results in hardship for the local businesses, especially when much of the external parking demands are long-term (all day.) Moreover, nearly all of the businesses along Barkley Avenue have a parking lot which is at or close to capacity during the day, requiring customers to rely on parking on-street that is often unavailable. This becomes a point of contention for area businesses when much of the available curbside parking is taken up by businesses from outside the area.

The photograph below illustrates the typically high level of parking demand in the subject

area during the day, which is further exacerbated by the parking intrusion from vehicles being stored on Barkley Avenue overnight.

The proposed overnight parking restrictions are not expected to have a negative impact on local businesses since it would go into effect each day after their closing times. The proponent has requested parking restrictions between 8:00PM and 7:00AM, which is after most businesses in the study area are closed. The start time of the restriction could be adjusted to accommodate any businesses in the area that are open later than 8:00 PM. Street sweeping operations in the study area are Wednesdays from 3:00 to 6:00 AM. The proposed overnight parking restrictions would allow for the replacement of the existing street sweeping signs, which will not add to area sign pollution.

Staff has determined that the request has merit and respectfully recommends that the Traffic Commission approve the proposed overnight parking restriction (8:00PM to 7:00AM) on both sides of Barkley Avenue between Batavia and Main Streets.



Angus Ave. Our office is located at 731 W. Angus and our business hours are from 6AM-5PM, M-F. By the time a few of our employees arrive to work by 5:30AM, vehicles are already buzzing in and parking on the street is full. People park on the street and then walk to their place of employment on Batavia. By the time the rest of our employees arrive between 7:30-7:45AM there is absolutely nowhere on the street to park...I am mean nowhere. Our company has already expanded our driveway to accommodate parking for our employees and we have absolutely no more room for expansion. One person said they worked for Tolly Landscaping located at 601 Batavia St. There are also a few auto repair shops that park vehicles on the street for weeks to months at a time. We have called the parking control department several times and will continue do so to prevent vehicles from being parked long term. Cars start rolling in on the street starting at 5AM and stay parked until 4-4:30PM, M-F. Is it possible to post a sign ... "No Overnight Parking" or "No Parking between Midnight and 8AM"? We only need 4-5 parking spaces. I am hoping that the City of Orange is able to come up with some resolution regarding this issue. It's bad enough that we have to continually call the parking control department on vehicles that are parked weeks to months at time from all the auto repair companies in the area. I have attached a few pictures/videos of the parking along the street. I really appreciate your assistance in this matter and if you have any questions, please do not

## 6. DISCUSSION AND BACKGROUND

This request is from a business owner in the building at 1136 to 1210 W. Collins Avenue. The reason for the request is to provide short-term parking in front of the businesses for their customers. There are a number of auto repair businesses in the area and employees appear to be utilizing the onstreet parking throughout the business day, starting early in the morning. The proponent indicated that the vehicles from the businesses across Collins Avenue detrimental effect for his customers.

#### <u>Analysis</u>

Field observation indicates the subject area has the only on street parking allowed on the south side of Collins Avenue between Main and Batavia Streets. This is a distance of 250 ft. or room for about 11 vehicles to park. There is a parking lot at the rear of the building however, this is employee parking only the only customer access the businesses is on Collins Avenue. According to the proponent the auto repair business is parking employee and customer vehicles in front of the subject addresses all

day leaving little to no space for the proponent's customers to park. The photograph below is indicative of the daily parking demand in front of the subject addresses.



#### **Recommendation**

Based on the field review, staff finds that the request has merit and recommends the Traffic Commission approve the installation of "1 HOUR PARKING" Signs between the addresses of 1136 and 1210 W. Collins Avenue to provide turnover parking in front of the subject businesses.



## 6. DISCUSSION AND BACKGROUND


A resident requested a disabled parking space in front of 292 N. Frampton Street. Frampton Street is a short cul-de-sac street that intersects with Palm Avenue west of Batavia Street. The proponent demonstrated the need for the disabled space and staff supported this request.

At the time the request was made, it was unclear when Traffic Commission meetings would resume. Because the matter was related to health and safety, staff elected to process the request and ask the Commission consider ratifying the change at its next regular meeting.

Prior to the change being made, staff performed neighborhood outreach to determine if there were any objections to the proposed disabled parking space. On October 1, 2020, notification letters were mailed to residents living within a 300' radius of the subject address. The letter (a) informed residents that the city was planning to install the disabled parking space and (b) asked that any concerns be expressed by October 19. No objections were received and the parking space was subsequently installed on November 11, 2020.

Staff respectfully recommends that the Traffic Commission ratify this request.



### 1. SUBJECT

Request for the installation of a STOP control at the intersection of Culver Avenue and Pixley Street.

### 2. SUMMARY

The request is to install a STOP control at the intersection of Culver Avenue and Pixley Street.

#### 3. RECOMMENDED ACTION

It is recommended that the Traffic Commission approve the installation of a two way stop control for east and west bound Culver Avenue at Pixley Street.

#### 4. FISCAL IMPACT

The total expenditure for the project is \$500 and will be funded in Minor Traffic Control Devices (16302) through Traffic Improvement Measure M2 (263).

### 5. STRATEGIC PLAN GOALS

Goal 1: Provide for a safe community

b. Provide and maintain infrastructure necessary to ensure the safety of the public.

#### 6. DISCUSSION AND BACKGROUND

A resident of South Pixley Street is requesting the installation of a STOP control at the intersection of Culver Ave. and Pixley St. to enhance motorist safety. Pursuant to the request, a STOP control traffic study was conducted at the subject intersection. The results are as follows.

#### Existing Conditions

Both Culver Ave. and Pixley St. are classified as Local streets in the study area. Culver Ave. runs in an east-west direction terminating east of the subject intersection at Montgomery Way. Pixley St. runs in a north-south direction. Both streets are residentially developed with a mixture of single-family dwelling units and small apartment buildings. Curbside parking is allowed on both streets in the study area and demand is moderate during the day and quite high in the evening. The speed limit for both streets is a prima fascia 25 MPH. The subject intersection is uncontrolled; however both streets meet at right angles with adequate sight distance.

#### Accident History

The accident history at the subject intersection was reviewed for the past three-year period. Our records indicate that there have been no reported accidents at this location during that time.

#### Traffic Volume Characteristics

Turning movement counts were conducted at the subject intersection for both the AM and PM peak traffic hours. 83 vehicles were counted entering the intersection from all approaches during the AM peak hour (7:30-8:30 AM). 94 vehicles were counted entering the intersection during the PM peak hour (4:30-5:30 PM).

#### Intersection Geometry

The subject intersection has good sight distance for all approaches.

#### Warrant Analysis

The Traffic Engineering Division has a policy of recommending STOP controls based on the following criteria:

- 1. <u>Accident History</u> Three or more correctable accidents in a 12-month period. *There were no reported accidents for the past 12-month period.*
- 2. <u>Traffic Volume</u> A total of 100 vehicles entering the subject intersection from all approaches during each of the peak hours of a typical day. 83 vehicles presently enter the intersection during the AM peak hour. 94 vehicles presently enter the intersection during the PM peak. Close to meeting the volume warrant.
- 3. <u>Intersection Geometry/ Design</u> A geometric problem exists to the extent that a controlled flow of vehicular traffic through the intersection is required and such control cannot be accomplished by less restrictive means. *Culver Avenue and Pixley Street intersects at a right angle, sight distance is good for all approaches. Geometry does not create a problem for motorists.*

Based on the above warrant analysis the subject intersection is reasonably close to meeting the traffic volume warrant. Traffic volumes have been depressed due to the lock down, it is reasonable assume that as the state begins to open up these traffic volumes will meet or exceed the minimum volume warrant within a few months. Staff therefore recommends that the Traffic Commission approve the installation of a two way stop control on Pixley Street at Culver Avenue.

I live on the corner of S Pixley and W Culver and there is no stop sign for either of those streets. On a daily basis there are people speeding, and near-miss accidents. Just in the last month my husband and I witnessed a car traveling at such dangerous speeds (heading north on Pixley) that when they hit the dip on Pixley the entire vehicle went airborne. Fortunately they did not lose control of their vehicle but if they had there was a neighbor walking their dog right there! Due to there not being thru traffic on S Parker (another issue that I think should be addressed), and the businesses allowed on S Montgomery Way there is an excessive amount of traffic that comes down S Pixley and in order to keep the kids, pets and resident safe there needs to be a stop sign, at the very least, on Culver, but preferably on Pixley as well to combat the speeding that goes on.
