1. SUBJECT

Appropriation of \$118,334.68 in designated Public Safety Realignment/Assembly Bill 109 funding received from the County of Orange

2. SUMMARY

Appropriation of \$118,334.68 in funding from the County of Orange to support the Orange Police Department's assistance to the Orange County Probation Department with case management and supervision of adult felon offenders during Fiscal Year 2025-2026.

3. RECOMMENDED ACTION

1. Accept into the City's General Fund (100) revenue budget a \$118,334.68 deposit from the County of Orange to:
 - 100-4131-43299-254024 Other - Post Release Community Supervision
2. Authorize the appropriation of \$118,334.68 into General Fund (100):
 - 100-4131-51003-254024 Overtime - Post Release Com. Supervision \$105,455.60
 - 100-4131-53199-254024 Miscellaneous Operating Supplies \$12,879.08

4. FISCAL IMPACT

There is no direct fiscal impact to the City. The additional revenue received from the County of Orange will fund the expense for this program.

6. DISCUSSION AND BACKGROUND

In 2011, the Public Safety Realignment Act, recognized as Assembly Bill 109 (AB109) shifted responsibility for the supervision of certain adult felony offenders from the California Department of Corrections and Rehabilitation to county jurisdictions under the Post Release Community Supervision (PRCS) program. AB109 is intended to reduce state prison overcrowding and support the reintegration of eligible offenders into local communities.

Individuals eligible for PRCS supervision generally:

- Are incarcerated for non-violent and non-serious offenses
- Are released on parole and non-revocable parole
- Are not high-risk sex offenders

The Orange Police Department collaborates closely with the Orange County Probation Department to monitor these individuals, including conducting compliance checks and coordinated enforcement operations.

The allocation of \$118,334.68 to the City of Orange Police Department supports overtime and operational costs associated with these public safety efforts during Fiscal Year 2025-2026.
